Ballycastle: *Baile an Chaistil* = The town of the Castle.

Armoy: *Oirthear Máigh*: East of the Plain

Muileann na Búise: Bushmills.

Rathlin: None locally as *Reachraidh* as is also heard in English particularly among the older folk (pronounced Racrey). An ancient name meaning which is unclear.
