### Irish Language Corner

Some more places names for you. All had Gaelic names which have been corrupted to the English form. In some cases places, such as 'Twenty Acres' had a superimposed English name over an older Gaelic name. Here we have given the original name and its meaning. Craigban *An Chreag Bhán* "the white rock" Craigfad *An Chreag Fhada* "the long rock" Acravally *Acra Bhile* "acre of the old tree" Altagore *Allt an Ghabhair* "steep glen/stream of the goat" Ardaghmore or Glentop *Ardach Mór* "high field, big" Twenty Acres *Droim na Meallóg* "ridge of the small mounds" Brackney *Breacnaigh* "speckled place" Broughanlea *An Bruachán Liath* "the small grey bank"
