ACHL Division 2

Sunday 17th June 2012:

Carey 1.9 Glenariffe 3.22

Carey started on the attack with Ciaran McCaughan sending a ball into full forward Colin Smyth who sent it over the bar. Glenariffe replied instantly and within 30secs Dan McKillop had equalised. Approaching 2mins Carey's Shane McCambridge battled for the ball and won it, passing to James McCouaig who sent it into the forward line where Martin McAuley pulled on it sending it into the back of the net. Once again Glenariffe replied quickly and had 2 points in the board within a minute and a half. Glenariffe pointed a free after 5mins to leave things all square. Glenariffe starting slotting over the points while Carey couldn't seem to penetrate the visitors defence. Glenariffe found the back of the net after 28 and a half minutes and a pointed free by James Black in the dying minutes left 8 between the sides going into the break.

Half time score: Carey 1.3 Glenariffe 1.11

A very quick Glenariffe 20m free after just 15secs was sent over the bar by McIntosh. Martin McAuley got Carey's second half started with a point from a tight angle after 3min 20secs. This was followed up just 30secs later with a pointed 45m free by Cathal McAuley. Glenariffe went through a spell of dominance around 10mins into this half and over the next 7mins had added 6 points to the board and hit a couple of wides while Carey could only reply with a point by captain Cathal McAuley, set up by Sean McLoughlin. Glenariffe found the back of the net at the 17 and a half minute mark and got their 3rd goal of the match after 24 and a half mins. Glenariffe were just too strong on the day for the home side and came away with a comfortable 19 point victory.

Sunday 24th June 2012:

Tir na nÓg 2-16 Carey 1-13

With both sides desperately wanting a win following a few defeats Carey's James Black got the scoring under way after just 30secs. This was end to end stuff with the score being level on numerous occasions. Tir na nÓg pressure half way through this first half led to 3 unanswered points to lead by 3 after 20mins but Carey reduced the gap to 1 within the following 2mins. The Tir na nÓg lead increased once again to 3 before the midfield combo of Michael McVeigh and James Black combine well for James to send the ball over the bar in injury time to reduce the deficit to 2.

Half time score: Tir na nÓg 0.9 Carey 0.7

The second half started with Carey on the attack and by 3 minutes in Carey had added 3 points and had a 1 point lead. Steven McGinn was then forced to make 2 good saves 2 minutes apart to keep Carey ahead. After the second save Carey went straight up the other end of the pitch and Colly Smyth sent the ball to the back of the net to lead by 4. Approaching 10mins the home side rattled the back of the net and then added another point to leave things level once again with 11mins played. The next few minutes saw the sides exchange points before Tir na nÓg started to pull away in the last 6 minutes of play with a few unanswered points while Carey's wide tally started to climb. In injury time there was 3 between the sides but in the dying minutes the home side found the back of the net to win by 6.

Sunday 15th July 2012:

St Galls 2-13 Carey 3-7

Playing with the wind in this half Carey started the match strongly and had a point on the board after just 30 seconds courtesy of Ciaran McCaughan who received a long ball in from John McBride. St Galls levelled things after 2 and a half mins. Carey then had a few wides before Martin Hunter received a ball in from Cathal McAuley and drove it into the back of the net to take a 3 point lead after 7 minutes. St Galls got their second point of the match approaching 13 and a half minutes but Carey upped the pressure once again and St Galls had to work hard to clear a couple of balls from their square. This huge amount of pressure eventually resulted in a 21 metre free, which Cathal McAuley took and smashed into the back of the net after 17 minutes. Patrick Butler added a further point for the visitors 2 minutes later to lead by 6. Steven McGinn was called into action on a few occasions and St Galls also had quite a few wides. Carey also had numerous opportunities in this half but couldn't make the most of it.

Half time score: St Galls 0.4 Carey 2.3

Carey converted a free after just 55 seconds of the restart to increase their lead to 6. St Galls then had two goal chances but were denied both the initial shot and the rebound. Mounting pressure by St Galls resulted in a goal to reduce Carey's lead to just 2 following some good saves by Steven before this. Over the next 2 minutes a point each was exchanged by both sides. St Galls then upped the intensity and forced Steven to make another save after 14 minutes and then added a goal and 3 points over the next 2 and a half minutes to take the lead in this match with a 4 point gap. Carey converted a free while St Galls added 2 before Ciaran McCaughan found the back of the net for Carey's 3rd goal of the match after 27 and a half minutes to leave just 2 between the sides. St Galls increased their lead to 3 approaching 31 minutes. In the dying minutes of the game Carey had a 25 metre free and had no option but to go low. Cathal's effort was saved and the final whistle was blown with the home side taking the points.

McCaughan Cup Quarter Final

Tuesday 19th July 2011:

Carey 2-12 Glenariffe 2.9

Carey made a very quick start finding the back of the net after just 15 seconds following a ball into the forward line by Daniel McAllister which was collected by Ciaran McCaughan and passed across the square to Gerard McAuley who finished it off. Glenariffe got their first point of the match after 4 minutes following a Carey wide by Patrick Butler a couple of minutes earlier. Patrick had another wide whilst Glenariffe found the target twice more before the 6 minute mark to leave things all square. Carey added 2 points before the Glenariffe centre half back was given a red card and Carey converted the resulting free to lead by 3. Glenariffe converted a free approaching 16 minutes to leave 2 between the sides but Carey replied straight away when the Carey puck out went straight to Tommy Devlin who sent a ball into the square where Gerard McAuley flicked it in the air into the back of the net. Another converted free by Carey at the 18 minute mark left 6 between the sides but Carey's keeper was soon called into action again when a Kearns shot had to be blocked down by the keeper and cleared by full back Gerard McBride.

Half time score: Carey 2.5 Glenariffe 0.6

Glenariffe started the second half with 2 wides. Carey's Gerard McAuley then forced the Glenariffe keeper to make a save after 3 minutes but just 20 seconds later Daniel McAllister converted a free to get the second half scoring under way. Glenariffe's first score of the second half came after 6 minutes and just over a minute later Kearns forced Liam McBride to make another save. Both sides had a wide apiece before a goalkeeping mistake led to a Glenariffe goal when a high ball in dropped in over the keepers stick. Carey replied with a JP McAuley point. A Glenariffe 45m free was converted after 19 and a half minutes to leave 4 between the sides. Glenariffe's 15 then converted another free but Patrick Butler replied within a minute with a Carey point and Gerard McAuley set substitute Kevin Murphy up for another point 2 minutes later to lead by 5. A long range Glenariffe free was dropped in and saved by keeper Liam McBride but the defence couldn't clear the loose ball and following a goal mouth scramble the ball eventually found the back of the net to leave just 2 in it after 29 and a half minutes. Carey kept their composure and went up the other end of the field to add a point by Ciaran McCaughan to help make sure of the victory before the final whistle sounded.
