Saturday 18th February 2012:

Setanta 0.4 Carey 0.8

Carey's first match of the season was a wet, miserable affair in County Donegal. Hail, wind and rain and a pitch in poor condition meant it was a very stop start match for this young Carey side with the ball getting stuck in holes in the pitch on numerous occasions. Both teams started brightly with Setanta opening the scoring with a pointed free after 2mins. A minute later Carey replied with a point by Cathal McAuley. Play couldn't get flowing in the harsh conditions and both sides just managed 2 more scores a piece before the whistle for half time.

Half time score: Setanta 0.3 Carey 0.3

The second half was brought to life a little with the addition of young Patrick McBride into the midfield area. This gave Carey a little more momentum going forward and helped stabilise the midfield area. Carey gave away a lot of controversial frees in scoreable positions in this half but fortunately Setanta couldn't find the target and keeper Steven McGinn also pulled off a few good saves. Carey did enough to take away the points in this low scoring game with a 4 point victory.

Saturday 10th March 2012:

Naomh Colum Cille 1.7 Carey 0.11

This was a tough contest for Carey on a very poor, boggy pitch and Naomh Colum Cille got on the scoring sheet first. Carey replied with 3 points but also had numerous wides before Naomh Colum Cille found the back of the net against the run of play to go a point up. Carey replied quickly with a pointed free to level and with some great play between Cathal McAuley and Kieran Kane Carey added a 5th to go a point ahead. 2 more points were added before half time to give Carey a 3 point cushion going into the break.

Half time score: Naomh Colum Cille 1.1 Carey 0.7

Carey had a few opportunities of scores at the start of the second half but hit them wide and it was Naomh Colum Cille who got on the score sheet first. Carey's first point came approaching 5 minutes and it was a well worked exchange between Martin McAuley and Kieran Kane. Carey had a goal chance approaching 10 minutes but it was fired high and wide. Naomh Colum Cille levelled the match approaching 14 minutes and then quickly added another point to take the lead. Carey levelled again after 16 minutes and 2 and a half minutes later went ahead with a well worked point which started from midfield from Steven McGinn, who handpassed to Tommy Devlin, who then laid it off to Patrick Butler. Once again the match was back on level terms at 23 minutes after Naomh Colum Cille had a goal chance which James saved and the loose ball was then fired over the bar. Carey took the lead again and a Naomh Colum Cille free in injury time had the Carey side waiting anxiously but fortunately it was hit wide and the final whistle was blown to give Carey a slender, hard earned 1 point victory. Carey showed great determination to grind out a victory in very heavy ground and despite giving away a few careless frees in the second half Carey tightened up in the last 10 minutes to ensure they came away with a win.
